BIOGRAPHY

Dr. Chezare A. Warren is the inaugural Associate Professor of Equity & Inclusion in Education Policy in the Department of Leadership, Policy, and Organizations at Vanderbilt University's Peabody College of Education and Human Development, making him the department's first Black tenured professor in its history. Dr. Warren has over a decade of professional experience as a public school educator, and was founding math teacher of the Urban Prep Charter Academy for Young Men in Chicago, IL. Prolific scholar, his work has garnered numerous accolades, including his selection as one of two education researchers in the US to receive a 2019 Ford Foundation Fellowship. He has served as the youngest president of the Critical Race Studies in Education Association, and Dr. Warren is author or co-author over 45 journal articles, book chapters, reviews, and reports. Chezare is set to release his debut EP tentatively titled Love Letter spring 2022. His music foregrounds themes of hope, humanity and love for self, blackness and Black people.
